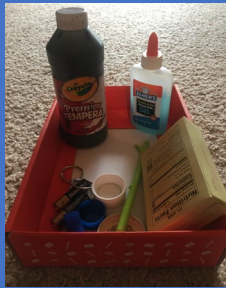
RECYCLED MATERIALS SCULPTURE

You may have seen *Silence-Music I* when you visited the Museum. Artist Louise Nevelson used wooden objects that she found on the streets of New York in her work. She painted the objects one color, usually black, which disguised the original identity of the object. In this activity, we are also going to use found objects to create our artwork.



DIRECTIONS



Supplies

- Anything recycled (cardboard, popsicle sticks, paper clips, toothpicks, bottle caps, whatever you want!)
- Pre-cut pieces of cardboard, approximately 4"x6"
- Glue
- Paint—pick one color, just like Louise Nevelson!

Choose which recycled items you want to use for your artwork. Arrange your items on your cardboard and decide how you would like your artwork to look. When you are happy with your arrangement, glue the pieces onto the cardboard. Once the glue is dry, paint your entire artwork with the color paint you have chosen.
